




# KINDERSMILE FOUNDATION 2016 GROWTH & OPPORTUNITY

# **AHELPING** HAND FOR **HEALTH**

KinderSmile Oral Health Program (KSOHP) has been the staple initiative of our charity since inception. While our volunteer dentists. hygienists and assistants provided free oral exams, cleanings, fluoride treatments and dental triage at local Head Start/Early Head Start sites, neighborhood child care centers and community health fairs, there was no place for our most severely afflicted pediatric patients to receive follow-up dental care.

Local emergency departments have wait lists of several months.

and the average cost for a non-emergent dental case can reach \$749 per visit-not to mention various other barriers to access that working, economically challenged families in our area face.

The grand-opening of KinderSmile Community Oral Health Center on August 29, 2016 marked an historic achievement for our nonprofit, though we continue to conduct offsite visits to bring diagnostic/preventive dental care and oral health education directly to local children.



# KINDERSMILE ORAL HEALTH PROGRAM

The construction of a dental home where Medicaid, Managed Care and uninsured patients from O-18 years old can access optimal oral health care and education not only provides the city of Bloomfield with a desperately-needed resource for low-income families; it also increases our ability to provide continuity of care for the children we have already been examining and educating for the last nine years.




# DENTAL HOME

# **MOTHER KNOWS BEST**

### Formerly Known as KinderSmile Pre/Postnatal Program

After past success partnering with NJ American Academy of Pediatrics to conduct small oral health workshops for pregnant and recently postpartum women, we proposed a pilot initiative to fund a targeted approach for empowering local mothers with information about their dental hygiene and its impact on their babies' development as well as providing direct access to high-quality oral health care regardless of the mom's ability to pay.

With the support of Healthcare Foundation of NJ and Partners for Health, we launched the Perinatal Health & Wellness Program in June 2016.

The goal of this pilot program was to identify 75 women who were uninsured and pregnant or caring for children up to 3 years old. We provide the moms with informative, personal, culturally sensitive training about the importance of maternaloral health and its impact on the developing fetus and infants/toddlers under their care.

Participants who complete the requisite 3 hours of oral health training become ambassadors of healthy habits to their communities, and they are eligible to receive all recommended follow-up dental care at KSCOHC, free of charge. In addition, all of their children from birth through 17 vears will be linked to KSCOHC for a continuous dental home.



# PERINATAL HEALTH & WELLNESS PROGRAM

"Pregnant women with chronic periodontal disease are up to 7x more likely to give birth prematurely."

When low-income pregnant women receive NJ State Medicaid benefits on a temporary basis, the covered benefits are only pregnancy/labor/delivery related. Oral health care is not included as part of pregnancyrelated services despite the proven link between dental health and overall well-being.

We launched PHWP in order to break the dangerous cycle of untreated dental diseases passed from generation to generation and to improve local rates of linking children to a dental home by age 1. In the first 6 months, we were able to enroll 41 perinatal women into the program, and 37% of participants had begun receiving free dental care.

# **ORAL HEALTH EDUCATION SYLLABUS**

### **TEETH & DECAY 101**

Program participants learn about the importance of a healthy mouth and the prevalence of dental disease.

### **IMPACT ON BABIES**

We stress the effect of maternal health on developing fetuses and offer a nonjudgmental look at prenatal health risks from smoking and nutrition to proper brushing and flossing teeth.

### **HEALTHY HABITS**

We emphasize the role of preventative fluoridization and regular clinical assessment for long-term health of the whole family.

# Birch Grove, Grenada



The shocking state of dental disease in Grenada was sadly not much worse than that of underserved kids in New Jersey. On this annual mission trip abroad, Dr. Kyung Ha joined Dr. Nicole and 12 CSLP volunteers to deliver \$200,474 in-kind dental care to students and caregivers.

# Port Au Prince, Haiti



Dr. Nicole returned for her annual trip to Port Au Prince, Haiti. This was her 2nd visit to *I'm Me Orphanage*, where she provided **\$34,165** in-kind professional services to disadvantaged children with limited access to quality health care.

# New! Internships



Opening our new facility allows interns to gain administrative work experience, exposure to public health advocacy and opportunities to shadow clinicians.



# FOSTERING LEADERSHIP, DOMESTIC & ABROAD

Our Community Service Learning Program (CSLP) offers mentoring and guidance to high school and college students in order to impart leadership skills and the value of contributing to the greater good.

Throughout the year, CSLP volunteers assist at various offsite visits by helping complete tooth charts and leading interactive education sessions with children to reinforce healthy dental hygiene habits. Their service at Give Kids A Smile Day is indispensable, helping to educate, treat and track approximately 100 children in one day.

Each spring, select volunteers participate in KinderSmile Foundation's mission trip abroad, delivering the same comprehensive dental care and oral health education to underserved children in a developing nation as they do in NJ.


